Monica Lee Heckel

Born May 16, 1957 in Toledo Ohio to the late Elizabeth A. Heckel-Gustafson and Lee A. Heckel went to be with her creator February 24, 2017.

Monica was a 1976 graduate of Cardinal Stritch High School, received degrees from University of Toledo, Northwest State and her Masters of Social Work from the University of Connecticut. She received a warrant from the United States Marine Corps as a Therapist and later continuing her Therapy services under her practice "On Eagles Wings" in New England until her return to Ohio in 2007.

Monica's faith was a very important aspect of her life serving as part of the Franciscan Sisters Order in both Sylvania Ohio and New Baltimore MI. Her desire in faith began in her youth with her involvement in the Toledo Diocesans C.Y.O. program receiving the Young Adult Service Award in 1984. She continued to serve the Diocesans as Director of TDCCW for the 13th district and still made tie to continue with the C.Y.O. program as a coach for the St Mary's Eagles girls' basketball program where she was lovingly known as Sister Mary Basketball by her team girls. She also served as Director of Religious Education for the Our Lady of Fatima Parish and later the Director of Faith Formation at St John United Church of Christ of Defiance, Ohio.

Monica is preceded in death by her Mother Elizabeth A. Gustafson, Goddaughter Elizabeth A. Hogue, grandparents Ralph and Rosella Heckel, Francis and Rosella Hogue, and Great Nephews William and Alexander Garbarczyk. Monica is survived by her Father Lee A. Heckel of Florida. Sisters Ann E. Lopez of Defiance, Diann L Vance of Metamora, Patricia S. Heckel of Delta, Brothers Lee A. Heckel of Toledo, and Paul J. Gustafson of Wauseon as well as many godchildren, nieces, and nephews.
